The garden was partly paved with sandstone flags and planting was added to the front and back of the stones to add colour and interest. "The design uses symmetry for a neat and ordered look that adds balance and harmony to the overall plan. The clients loved the idea of Mediterranean-style planting so we chose beds of white lavender, and a clipped bay tree was planted near the bay window to add fragrance when the windows are open in summer. A cool palette of white and green planting enhances the simplicity of this scheme. Tall alliums give vertical interest and structure in summer but the garden looks good all year round - evergreens are definitely the way forward!" >

"It seems obvious but the largest surface area in most small gardens will be perimeters. They can

be very difficult to hide. Most shrubs will be too bulky, and climbers look too leggy. If your fences are in a state of disrepair, consider painting them in a dark shade, or cladding them with timber, Perspex or metal. Dark colours will recede, and the planting in front of them will pop." earthdesigns.co.uk
